- Go to www.butte.edu click on the "APPLY NOW" button on the home page, create an account, complete and submit application (Applications may take 3 to 5 business days to process).

- Please enter your high school status accurately "Haven't completed 11th grade".
- Apply to Butte College before 1/9/18 to be eligible for the College Connection administration of the Basic Skills Assessment (BSA) in January. IF you apply to Butte after 1/9/18, you will need to call Butte College for BSA alternative dates.

- If you are already a Butte College student, please follow the instructions above to reapply.

Basic Skills Assessment (BSA)-needed for placement in Butte College courses

- Applicants MUST have a Butte College ID number to sign up for the BSA
- Call the Butte College Call Center (895-2511), identify yourself as College Connection applicant, ask for your Butte College ID # (if you do not know it), then ask for the Assessment Office and sign up for the BSA (choose ONE: Wednesday, January 17 <u>OR</u> Thursday, January 18). IF you need an alternative date, please ask about options.
- The January 17th & 18th BSA will be held at the Chico Center (2320 Forest Avenue) and begin at 4:00pm, please arrive by 3:45. The BSA is untimed, most students finish between 5:30 and 7:00 pm.
 - i. **Bring**: a copy of your high school transcript including your Spring 2018 courses in progress, a photo ID, and your Butte ID#.
