**REQUIRED ACTION FOR SCHOOLS: NEW HEALTH COVERAGE  
OPPORTUNITIES AND ENROLLMENT ASSISTANCE**

Beginning in the 2015–16 school year, California public schools were required under Assembly Bill 2706 (Hernandez) to provide information on affordable health coverage options and in-person enrollment assistance. The requirement also applies to the 2016–17 and 2017–18 school years.

More recently, Senate Bill 75 (Lara) expanded affordable Medi-Cal coverage to **all** children, regardless of their immigration status. This means that low-income, undocumented children can receive full Medi-Cal benefits. Eligible children can enroll today. In collaboration with the California Department of Education (CDE), the Children's Partnership's ALL IN For Health campaign, and California Coverage and Health Initiatives, Covered California created the **School Educator Partner Toolkit** for public school administrators to facilitate compliance with AB 2706 and raise awareness of SB 75. The kit includes sample language for newsletters, a one-page template in Spanish and English to include in weekly messages sent home with students, a list of county-based agencies, and other helpful resources. The template also includes a customizable space for information on local enrollment resources. As educators, we understand that the health and welfare of students is key to academic, social, emotional, and physical success.
